Dear Parent/Carer

Welcome to Park Lane Primary and Nursery School. We are very excited to welcome you to Reception! We have had a great start to the year, with all children settling in amazingly on their first week. We have been enjoying getting to know them and teaching them all about school life. This booklet is to inform you of what your child will be learning this term during our adult-led inputs. There are also some questions included to help your children to extend their learning at home. Alongside this, we will have weekly themes in our classrooms to excite and engage the children in their learning. These include All About Me, The Gruffalo, Space, Superheroes, People Who Help Us, Autumn and Pirates.

Mathematics (M)

This term we will be matching and sorting objects, comparing amounts, making repeated patterns and starting to learn about numbers.

What patterns can you make at home?

Literacy (L)

In Literacy this half term, we will be doing lots of mark making activities and letter play. We will also be learning new sounds in phonics. We will be learning to blend phonemes to read simple words and how to write simple words by segmenting sounds.

What letter sounds can you spot in the environment?

Personal, Social, Emotional Development (PSED)

During this term we will be talking about ourselves, our families and things we like and dislike. We will also be playing lots of games to get to know each other and learn all about our school rules and expectations. Can you share our school rules with someone at home?

Communication and Language (CL)

This term we will be doing lots of speaking and listening activities as a whole class and in small groups. We will be sharing our ideas and thoughts during Circle Time. We will also be listening to a range of texts including stories, poetry and non-fiction to help develop our vocabulary. Can you tell someone about your favourite story at school?

Physical Development (PD)

In PD we will be providing the children with lots of opportunities to demonstrate their fine and gross motor skills such as cutting, threading and drawing activities. We will also be playing with balls, hoops, beanbags and learning how to move safely in a variety of ways e.g running, skipping, walking, hopping. These sessions will take place on a Thursday morning. Please send your child to school in their sports clothes.

Understanding the World (UTW)

In UTW we will be learning lots of things about ourselves and our bodies. We will discuss things that are special to us, learn the names of various body parts and what our 5 senses are for. We will also be learning about Florence Nightingale and similarities/differences from the past.

Expressive Arts and Design (EAD)

In EAD we will be developing our creative and performance skills through singing, creating music and exploring different techniques of making art.
