Dear Parent/Carer,

Welcome back! We hope you have all had a lovely half term break and the children are coming back ready and raring to learn. Again, this term we will be exploring lots of different themes within our provision including celebrations, winter and fairytales. This booklet is to inform you of what your child will be learning this term. There are also some questions included to help your children to extend their learning at home.

Mathematics (M)

This term we will be continuing our learning on numbers 1-5. The children will be learning one more and one less within 5 as well as identifying and comparing shapes with 4 sides. We will also be looking at sequencing times of the day, using vocabulary such as morning, afternoon, today and tomorrow.

Can you go on a shape hunt and identify any objects that have 4 sides?

Literacy (L)

In Phonics children continue to develop their knowledge of set one sounds and blend to read words. Please try to spend 5 or so minutes each day going through children's RWI flashcards to strengthen their sound knowledge and read through their purple blending books.

In Literacy this half term, we are going to be starting Drawing Club which is so much fun! The children will be strengthening their pencil grip and control to draw pictures of characters and settings from their favourite stories as well as using their imagination to create new adventures. They will then be writing words and captions for their pictures, using their phonics knowledge to sound out and spell words.

Can you draw a picture of your most favourite character and write a word to describe them?

Personal, Social, Emotional Development (PSED)

During this term we will be learning about the importance of healthy eating – which foods we should be fuelling our bodies with and which we should be saving for a treat. We will also be developing our understanding of our school values 'Ready, Respectful, Safe' and what this looks like on our classroom.

Can you write/record a video to explain how we are ready, respectful and safe in our class?

Communication and Language (CL)

This term we will be doing lots of speaking and listening activities as a whole class and in small groups. We will be sharing our ideas and thoughts during Circle Time. We will also be listening to a range of texts including stories, poetry and non-fiction to help develop our vocabulary.

Can you tell someone about your favourite story at school?

Physical Development (PD)

In PD we will be continuing to develop the children's fine and gross motor skills through a range of activities such as cutting, threading and drawing activities. We will also be completing a netball unit, learning about moving in different ways, throwing and catching. These sessions will take place on a Thursday morning.

Can you showcase your netball skills at home or at the park?

Understanding the World (UTW)

In UTW we will be learning about festivals that are celebrated around the world. We will be focusing on Diwali celebrations and Christmas celebrations. We will also be learning the Christian Christmas story and will perform a class nativity play in December. Locally we will continue to visit Whittlesey library and learn why it is an important place in our local area.

Can you tell your family/friends why people celebrate Diwali?

Expressive Arts and Design (EAD)

In EAD we will be developing our creative and performance skills through music. Mrs Bradshaw is going to share her instruments with us and show us how to keep to a beat and move in time to music. We will also look at different ways of joining materials to make models.
