

Look at the shapes below. What do you notice about them? What is the same? What is different?




Talk about these sets of shapes. What do you notice?



Combine Shapes With 4 Sides



What shapes can you see?

Challenge Yourself:

- Find some 3D objects that have square and rectangle faces, such as building bricks. Use them to create representations of 2D squares and rectangles by dipping them in paint and printing onto paper. Talk about the shape that you think you will print and see if you are right.



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Shapes in the Environment

Go for a walk around your home or local area. See how many squares and rectangles you can spot around you.




Can you talk about any objects you see that are 'almost' squares or 'almost' rectangles? Talk about what makes them look like a square or rectangle.
